

Topics: comparisons, spatial relationships, positional words


Math Connections: Use The Birthday Box/Mi Caja de Cumpleaños to encourage your child to think of ways to play with and use a cardboard box. In the story, the box becomes an airplane, a boat, and a toboggan. It becomes an outfit that transforms the toddler into a robot. Finally it becomes a place to take a nap. Ask your child how they would transform a cardboard box into something else. What will it do? What will it be used for? Do they need anything other than imagination to turn the box into something else?

Reinforce the positional words found throughout the story. When reading the story together, take time to ask your child where the toddler is in relationship to the box in the pictures. Ask your child what they would put inside a box, on top of the box, and under the box, etc.

Extension Questions:

- 1. What would you do with the big brown box?
- 2. What could you stand on that would make you taller than a tree?
- Look at the snowman in the book. How would you describe the snowman to somebody who didn't know what it looked like? What directions would you give to somebody to build a snowman that looked like the one in the book?
- 4. What did the toddler add to the box to make it into an airplane? What did the toddler add to make it into a boat? What would you add to turn the box into a train?
